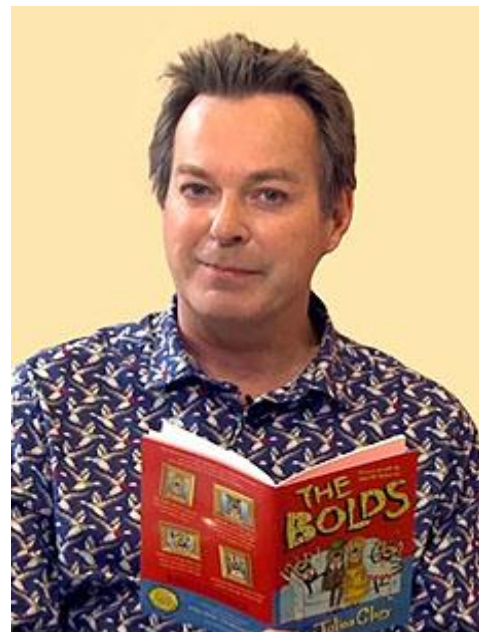
What my classmates thought about the visit
